

## A Whale of a Cloth

**Size:** approximately 9 X 8 ½"

**Materials:** One skein of worsted weight cotton in a solid color. The cloth pictured was done in Peaches & Crème in Peacock.

**Needles:** U.S. Size 6/4.0mm or 5/3.75mm Because this is a “picture” cloth, you want your fabric to be fairly dense so the design will pop out. If you are a loose knitter, then you might want to drop down a needle size.

**Gauge:** 4.5 sts. per inch, not critical.

**Abbreviations:**

k = knit

p = purl

sts. = stitches

**Pattern:** Cast on 39 stitches

Rows 1 - 7: knit.

Row 8: (wrong side) K3; (p3, k1, p1, k1) x5; p3; k3.

Row 9: k7; (p1, k5) x 4; p1; k7.

Row 10: k2, p35; k2.

Row 11: k3; (p3, k3) x6.

Row 12: K3; (p3, k1, p1, k1) x5; p3; k3.

Row 13: k7; (p1, k5) x 4; p1; k7.

Row 14: k2; p35; k2.

Row 15: k3; p3; k27; p3; k3.

Row 16: k3; p33; k3.

Row 17: knit.

Row 18: k2; p35; k2.

Row 19: k3; p3; k5; p17; k5; p3; k3.

Row 20: k3; p7; k1; p17; k1; p7; k3.

Row 21: k9; p1; k3; p4; k12; p1; k9.

Row 22: k2; p6; k1; p12; k1; p3; k1; p4; k1; p6; k2.

Row 23: k3; p3; k1; p1; k5; p1; k4; p1; k7; p5; k2; p3; k3.

Row 24: k3; p5; k1; p4; (k1, p5) x3; k1; p4; k3.

Row 25: k7; p1; k6; p1; k4; p1; k11; p1; k7.

Row 26: k2; p5; k1; p11; k1; p3; k1; p7; k1; p5; k2.

Row 27: k3; p3; k1; p1; k8; p1; k14; p1; k1; p3; k3.

Row 28: k3; p4; k1; p23; k1; p4; k3.

Row 29: k7; p1; k17; p1; k5; p1; k7.

Row 30: k2; p5; k1; p23; k1; p5; k2.

Row 31: k3; p3; k1; p1; k23; p1; k1; p3; k3.

Row 32: k3; p4; k1; p13; k3; p7; k1; p4; k3.

Row 33: k8; p1; k5; p1; k3; p1; k12; p1; k7.

Row 34: k2; p5; k1; p11; k1; p5; k1; p4; k1; p6; k2.

Row 35: k3; p3; k2; p1; k4; p1; k6; p1; k9; p1; k2; p3; k3.

Row 36: k3; p6; k1; p8; k1; p6; k1; p4; k1; p5; k3.

Row 37: k9; p1; k3; p1; k7; p1; k6; p1; k10.

Row 38: k2; p9; k6; p8; k1; p3; k1; p7; k2.

Row 39: k3; p3; k3; p1; k4; p1; k18; p3; k3.

Row 40: k3; p21; k1; p4; k1; p6; k3.

Row 41: k9; p1; k5; p4; k20.

Row 42: k2; p17; k1; p9; k1; p7; k2.

Row 43: k3; p3; k3; p1; k9; p1; k13; p3; k3.

Row 44: k3; p17; k1; p9; k1; p5; k3.

Row 45: k8; p1; k4; p1; k3; p1; k21.

Row 46: k2; p20; k3; p1; k1; p3; k1; p6; k2.

Row 47: k3; p3; k1; p1; k3; p1; k21; p3; k3.

Row 48: k3; p24; k1; p3; k1; p4; k3.

Row 49: k8; p3; k28.

Row 50: k2; p35; k2.

Row 51: k3; p3; k27; p3; k3

Row 52: k3; p33; k3.

Row 53: knit.

Row 54: k2; p35; k2.

Row 55: k3; (p3, k3) x6.

Row 56: k3; (p3, k1, p1, k1) X5; p3; k3.

Row 57: k7; (p1, k5) x4; p1; k7.

Row 58: k2; p35; k2.

Row 59: k3; (p3, k3) x6.

Rows 60 – 66: knit.

Bind off purlwise and weave in ends.
